

# HANNIBAL-LAGRANGE UNIVERSITY ANNUAL SAFETY AND SECURITY REPORT

## Timely Warnings

In the event that a situation arises, either on or off campus, that, in the judgment of the HLGU Administration, constitutes an ongoing or continuing threat, a campus wide “timely warning” will be issued. The warning will be issued through the HLG ALERT.

Depending on the particular circumstances of the crime, especially in all situations that could pose an immediate threat to the HLGU community, Student Development may also post a notice on the Hannibal-LaGrange University web site at <http://www.hlg.u.edu>, providing the HLGU community with more immediate notification. In such instances, a copy of the notice is posted in each residence hall, at the front door of each on-campus apartment or quad and in the Student Development Office. The web-site is immediately accessible via computer by all faculty, staff and students. Anyone with information warranting a timely warning should report the circumstances to the Director of Public Safety by phone at (573-248-6268) or in person at the Student Development Office on the first floor of the Burt Administration Building.

## Policy for Reporting the Annual Disclosure of Crime Statistics

Hannibal-LaGrange University Department of Public Safety prepares this report to comply with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Public Safety Policy and Crime Statistics Act. The full text of this report can be obtained in the Public Safety Office. This report is prepared in cooperation with the local law enforcement agencies surrounding our main campus, residential life staff, and the Student Development Office. Each entity provides updated information on their educational efforts and programs to comply with the Jeanne Clery Act.

Campus crime, arrest and referral statistics include those reported to the Public Safety Office, and local law enforcement agencies. These statistics may also include crimes that have occurred in private residences or businesses and is not required by law.

Copies of the report may be obtained by visiting the HLGU Department of Public Safety Office located adjacent to the Student Development Office on the first floor of the Burt Administration Building, or by calling Public Safety Office (573) 629-3012. Any suspicious activity or person seen in the parking lots or loitering around vehicles, inside buildings or around the residential halls should be reported to the HLGU Department of Public Safety. ## Confidential Reporting Procedures

If you are the victim of a crime and do not want to pursue action with the HLGU Department of Public Safety or with Hannibal Police Department, you may still want to consider making a confidential report. With your permission, the Director of Public Safety can file a report on the details of the incident without revealing your identity. The purpose of a confidential report is to comply with your wish to keep the matter confidential, while taking steps to ensure the future safety of yourself and others. With such information, the University can keep an accurate record

of the number of incidents involving students, determine where there is a pattern of crime with regard to a particular location, method, or assailant, and alert the campus community to potential danger. Reports filed in this manner are counted and disclosed in the annual crimes statistics for the institution.

### **Access Policy**

During business hours, the University (excluding certain housing facilities) will be open to students, parents, employees, contractors, guests, and invites. During non-business hours, access to all University facilities is by key, if issued, or by admittance via the Department of Public Safety. In the case of periods of extended closing, the University will admit only those with prior written approval.

Residence halls are secured 24 hours a day. Some facilities may have individual hours, which may vary at different times of the year. Examples are the Burt Administration Building, Roland Library, Roland Fine Arts Center, Partee Center, and the Mabee Sports Complex.

### **Public Safety Authority and Jurisdiction**

Hannibal-LaGrange University Department of Public Safety officers have the authority to ask persons for identification and to determine whether individuals have lawful business at HLGU. Public Safety officers have the authority to issue parking tickets, which are billed to student accounts. Public Safety officers do not possess arrest power. Criminal incidents are referred to the local police who have jurisdiction on the campus.

The HLGU Department of Public Safety maintains a highly professional working relationship with the Hannibal Police Department. All crime victims and witnesses are strongly encouraged to immediately report the crime to the HLGU Department of Public Safety and the appropriate police agency. Prompt reporting will assure timely warning notices on-campus and timely disclosure of crime statistics.

### **General Procedures for Reporting a Crime or Emergency**

Community members, students, faculty, staff, and guests are encouraged to report all crimes and public safety related incidents to the Department of Public Safety in a timely manner. To report a crime or an emergency on the campus of Hannibal-LaGrange University, call the Department of Public Safety at 573-248-6268. To report a non-emergency, call Public Safety at 573-629-3012.

All incident reports are forwarded to the Dean of Student Development for review and potential disciplinary action on behalf of the University. The Department of Public Safety will investigate a report when it is deemed appropriate. Additional information obtained via the investigation will also be forwarded to the Student Development Office.

If assistance is required from the Hannibal Police Department or Hannibal Fire Department, the Department of Public Safety will contact the appropriate unit. If a sexual assault or rape should occur, staff on the scene, including Public Safety, will offer the victim a wide variety of services.

Information about on-campus and off-campus resources for crime victims can be obtained in the student development office. This information is made available to provide HLGU community members with specific information about the resources that are available in the event that they become the victim of a crime.

Crimes should be reported to the Department of Public Safety to ensure inclusion in the annual crime statistics and to aid in providing timely warning notices to the community, when appropriate.

## **Crime Prevention Programs**

Crime Prevention Programs on personal safety and theft prevention are sponsored by various campus organizations throughout the year. Public Safety personnel facilitate programs for students, parents, faculty, new employee orientations, student organizations, in addition to programs for resident life, Residence Hall Directors, resident advisors, and residents providing a variety of educational strategies and tips on how to protect themselves from sexual assault, theft and other crimes.

To enhance personal safety, and especially after an evening class, walk with friends or someone from class that you know well, or call the Department of Public Safety for an escort.

## **Criminal Activity Off Campus**

In the event that a Hannibal-LaGrange University student is involved in an off-campus offense, Public Safety officers may assist with the investigation in coordinating with local, state, or federal law enforcement. Hannibal Police Department routinely works and communicates with Public Safety officers on any events occurring on-campus or in the immediate neighborhood and business areas surrounding campus.

## **Policy on Alcoholic Beverages**

As a Christian University supported by the Missouri Baptist Convention, HLGU takes the position of abstinence from the use of alcoholic beverages both on and off campus. Consequently, possession of alcohol, use of alcohol, and/or being under the influence of alcohol, is not permitted on University premises or at University-sponsored or supervised activities. Whether a student has violated this policy's prohibition against use of alcohol or illegal drugs may be determined by circumstantial evidence such as the aroma or smell of alcohol or drugs, either in the room or on the student's person, or conduct suggesting that the student is under the influence of such substances. In addition to being considered a violation of the Standard of Student Conduct, Missouri state law prohibits any person less than twenty-one (21) years of age to possess and/or use alcoholic beverages.

Violation of this policy may result in any sanction deemed appropriate by the University, including, but not limited to, fines, required participation in a drug or alcohol treatment or rehabilitation program (at the student's expense), suspension, or expulsion. HLGU may refer any violation of the law to the proper law enforcement authorities.

If a student feels they have a drug or alcohol dependency they may seek help and direction from the Residential Life staff without fear of retribution. Alcohol and drug dependency does not give students an excuse to violate the University's alcohol and drug policy.

## **Policy on Illegal Drugs**

Hannibal-LaGrange University takes the position of abstinence regarding the use and/or possession of illegal or controlled substances. HLGU students are prohibited from using and/or possessing any illegal or controlled substance unless prescribed by a physician. The actions of HLGU are not based upon or in any way limited by the actions, or lack thereof, of the legal system.

## **ALCOHOL & SUBSTANCE ABUSE INFORMATION**

Local, State & Federal Legal Sanctions Legal Sanctions – Laws Governing Alcohol

The State of Missouri sets 21 as the minimum age to purchase or possess any alcoholic beverage. Specific ordinances regarding violations of alcohol laws, including driving while intoxicated, are available from Hannibal Police Department.

All students are expected to abide by the laws of the local, state, and national government and are subject to judicial action at the hands of the University and/or law enforcement agencies. Formal charges, complaints, or indictments by governmental entities are not prerequisites for University action. In all cases of violation of University rules and regulations, or actions in violation of local, state, and federal laws, Hannibal-LaGrange University reserves the right to proceed with its own disciplinary action independent of governmental charges or prosecution.

## **Sexual Assault Policy**

In the event of a sexual assault, the victim should be aware of the following procedures:

1. Report the incident to the following:
  - a. Hannibal Police Department; 777 Broadway, Hannibal, Mo (573) 221-0987
  - b. A victim that is a student should inform a member of the residence life staff.  
Employees should inform an administrator or the director of public safety
2. Seek medical assistance (Ambulance: (573) 221-5000) (Hannibal Regional Hospital (573) 221-1491)
3. Consider the importance of preserving evidence. Do not shower.
4. Seek counseling
5. Consider pressing charges
6. If the accused is a student; disciplinary actions may also be taken by the institution at the appropriate time with both the accused and the accuser informed of the outcome.
7. Consider requesting changes regarding academic and living situations. Changes will be made if requests are received that may be reasonably accommodated. Requests for changes should be addressed to the Dean of Student Development.
8. The accuser and accused are entitled to the same opportunities to have others present during a disciplinary proceeding.
9. Both the accuser and accused shall be informed of the outcome of any institutional disciplinary proceeding brought alleging a sex offense (the institution's final determination and any sanction against the accused).
10. Refer to the student guidelines and expectation section of the handbook to learn about discipline and sanctions related to sexual assault.

## **Missing Student Notification Policy**

In compliance with the Missing Student Procedures 20 USC 1092 (j) (Section 488 of the Higher Education Opportunity Act of 2008), it is the policy of Hannibal-LaGrange University Department of Public Safety to investigate any report of a missing student who resides on-campus at HLGU. This policy establishes a framework for cooperation among members of the University community aimed at locating and assisting students who are reported missing.

A student shall be deemed missing when he or she is reported absent from the University for more than 24 hours without any known reason. All reports of missing students shall be directed to HLGU's Public Safety which shall investigate each report and make a determination whether a student is missing in accordance with this policy.

Each student living in an on-campus student housing facility has the option to identify an individual to be contacted by the University not later than 24 hours after the time that the student is determined missing in accordance with official notification procedures established by HLGU.

Each student living in an on campus student housing facility has the option to register confidential contact information. Only authorized campus officials and law enforcement officers in furtherance of a missing person investigation may have access to this information.

If a missing student is under 18 years of age, and not an emancipated individual, the University is required to notify a custodial parent or guardian of the missing student not later than 24 hours after the determination by Public Safety that the student is missing.

HLGU's Public Safety will also notify the Hannibal Police Department no later than 24 hours after it determines that the student is missing, even if a student has not registered a contact person.

If Public Safety has been notified and makes a determination that a student who is the subject of a missing person report has been missing for more than 24 hours and has not returned to the campus, the institution will initiate the emergency contact procedures in accordance with the student's designation.

The Dean of Student Development shall have the responsibility to make the provisions of this policy and the procedures set forth below available to students.

### **Missing Student Notification Procedures**

1. Any report of a missing student, from whatever source, should immediately be reported to HLGU's Public Safety.
2. When a student is reported missing, Public Safety shall:
  - a. Initiate an investigation to determine the validity of the missing person report;
  - b. Contact the Dean of Student Development;
  - c. Make a determination as to the status of the missing student;
  - d. Notify Hannibal Police Department or other appropriate law enforcement agencies within 24 hours after determining that the student is missing.
3. When contacted by Public Safety, the Dean of Student development shall:
  - a. Notify the Associate Director of Residential Life and the HLGU President;
  - b. If, during an investigation of an official report, Public Safety determines that the identified student is missing, the Dean of Student Development will notify the individual's recognized emergency contact person within 24 hours of making the determination that the student is missing;
  - c. If the missing student is under the age of 18, and not an emancipated individual, attempts to notify will be made to the student's custodial parent or guardian as contained in the records of the University within 24 hours of the determination that the student is missing.
4. The Dean of Student Development shall initiate whatever action he or she deems appropriate under the circumstances in the best interest of the missing student.

### **Student Contact Information**

Students residing on-campus shall be given the opportunity to identify and register a confidential contact person or persons to be notified in the case that the student is determined to be missing. Only authorized campus officials and law enforcement officers in furtherance of a missing

person investigation may have access to this information. If a resident is under 18 years of age, and not an emancipated individual, the custodial parent or guardian must be the contact person.

Students residing on-campus will have the opportunity to complete the Student Health Form when they move into campus housing. It is the responsibility of the student to update any changes to contact information.

## **Housing Fire Safety Equipment**

All housing is equipped with fire extinguishers and smoke detectors. In addition, Memorial Hall, Fletcher Hall North, Fletcher Hall South, and Crouch Hall are equipped with fire suppression systems. Fletcher Hall North, Fletcher Hall South, and Crouch Hall are monitored 24/7/365 by an outside agency.

Fire extinguishers are centrally located in kitchens and hallways. Smoke detectors and fire extinguishers are inspected annually

## **Electrical Devices and Open Flames**

The possession of candles, candle warmers, incense, fireworks, firearms, or any other open flame apparatus are prohibited. Halogen lamps, heating units, hot plates are not allowed as well.

Hannibal-LaGrange University is a smoke-free campus.

## **Fire Evacuation Procedures**

Be prepared for fires. Know the location of the fire extinguisher, pull station, exits, and evacuation routes in your area. In the event of a fire:

- Immediately sound the alarm and/or evacuate the area/building. Notify the fire department by calling 911.
- Notify HLGU's Public safety by calling 573-248-6268
- Do not attempt to extinguish the fire unless it is safe to do so. Do not risk personal harm.
  
- When evacuating; it may be necessary to crawl on hands and knees to avoid smoke. The safest air is generally 1-2 feet above the floor. If trapped inside, call for help, open a window and notify those outside. Seal off the door and air vents if possible.
- Once outside, do not re-enter the building until cleared to do so by the fire department. Assemble at the designated area. Account for all persons known to have been inside the building.

## **Fire Safety Education and Training**

The University will conduct one fire drill each semester in residential halls. All residents must comply with the directions of the drills. Procedures will be posted in each residence hall or instructed by a residence life staff member.

## **Plans for Future Improvements in Fire Safety**

The Department of Public Safety, together with the physical plant and residence life, monitors, analyses, and makes recommendations for safety in campus housing. At this time there are no plans to make any improvements.

## **Fire Definition and Reporting**

For the purposes of fire safety reporting, a fire is, “any instance of open flame or other burning in a place not intended to contain the burning or in an uncontrolled manner.”

All known fires should be reported to HLGU’s Department of Public Safety as soon as possible.

## **Student Housing Fire Safety Systems**

Fletcher Hall South is a two story building with a capacity of 49 (male) residents. There are three person rooms that have a kitchenette and a bathroom and four person suites that are divided by a kitchenette with two students and a bathroom on either side. Each room is equipped with smoke detectors. Fire extinguishers are located in the lobbies on both floors. The dorm is equipped with a fire alarm system that is monitored 24/7 by an outside agency.

Fletcher Hall North is a two story building with a capacity of 56 (male) residents. There are three person rooms that have a kitchenette and a bathroom and four person suites that are divided by a kitchenette with two students and a bathroom on either side. Each room is equipped with smoke detectors. Fire extinguishers are located in the lobbies on both floors. The dorm is equipped with a fire alarm system that is monitored 24/7 by an outside agency.

Heimer Lane Quads are three separate one story buildings with four separate apartments. Each apartment has the capacity of four students therefore each building has the capacity of 16 students. The Heimer Lane Quads have a total capacity of 48 students. Each apartment has five rooms. (Kitchen, living room, bathroom, two bedrooms) Each apartment is equipped with four smoke detectors. The smoke detectors are located in the kitchen area, bathroom area, and one in each bedroom. Fire extinguishers are located in the kitchen of each apartment.

Memorial Hall is a two story building with a capacity of 94 (female) residents. There is one student living in each room and an adjoining bath between each suite of two rooms. Each room is equipped with a smoke detector. Fire extinguishers are located at the end of every hall way and centrally located by the laundry rooms and kitchen. Sprinklers are located in every bedroom and other areas throughout the building.

Nunn-Cook Hall is a three story building with a max occupancy of 74 male residents. There are two students per room with a community style bathroom on each wing. There is one single occupancy room and three, three occupancy rooms on the third floor. There is a laundry room on each floor. Each room is equipped with smoke detectors. There are centrally located fire extinguishers on each hall that are clearly marked.

Crouch Hall is a two story building with a max occupancy of 32 male residents. There are two residents per room with a community style bathroom on each wing. Each room is equipped with smoke detectors. There are centrally located fire extinguishers on each hall that are clearly

marked. Crouch Hall is fully equipped with a fire sprinkler system and a fire alarm system that is monitored 24/7 by an outside agency.

Kleckner Hall is a two story building with the capacity to hold 52 (female) residents. There are three lobbies, one laundry room and a large kitchen. There are four halls with seven rooms on each hall. There are two students per room and one bathroom per hall. Each room is equipped with a smoke detector and fire extinguishers are located on each hall. Kleckner is also equipped with a fire alarm system that sounds throughout the entire dorm.

The Prince House is a two story house with six bedrooms, a living room, dining room, kitchen, basement, and garage. The house has the ability to house 12 (female) residents. There are four bedrooms that sleep two students per room, one bedroom that sleeps three students and one bedroom that sleeps one student. There is a full bathroom located on the second floor and two full bathrooms located on the first floor. There is a smoke detector located in each bedroom and in the kitchen. The laundry room is located in the basement. There is a front and a back door, both of which are available for student use. There is an entrance to the garage from the kitchen although this is not used as an entrance or exit.

The Hagerman House is a one story house with a capacity of seven (female) students. It has three bedrooms, two full baths, a living room, kitchen and dining room combination and a garage. Two of the bedrooms sleep two girls in each and one of the bedrooms sleeps three students. There are laundry facilities located in the garage. There is a smoke detector located in each bedroom. There is a front door and a backdoor that is located in one of the three bedrooms, both entrances/exits are for students to use. There is an entrance to the garage from the kitchen, although, this is not used for an entrance or an exit, only when laundry facilities are needed.

The Pulliam Street Apartments are comprised of four, one story buildings with the ability to hold 24 (female) students altogether. Two of the apartment units sleep two girls on each side of the building with a dividing wall in between each unit. Each of these four units has a bedroom, kitchen and full bathroom. The other two apartment units sleep four girls on each side of the building with a dividing wall in between each unit. Each of these four units has a kitchen, full bathroom, living room and two bedrooms. Each unit in every different building has a smoke detector in each bedroom and a fire extinguisher in each kitchen. There is a front and a back door on each unit for students to use.

Pulliam Hall has 36 rooms and each room holds two residents with the exception of three rooms that hold three residents, Pulliam Hall has a capacity of 75 female students. Fire extinguishers are centrally located throughout the building. There are hard-wired detectors located in the hallways on every floor. Smoke detectors are also located in the kitchen, stairwell, and lobby. Emergency lights are located in the hallways on each floor and the stairwell. Each room is equipped with a battery operated smoke detector.

The Becky Thatcher contains six rooms that can hold two residents each making its capacity 12. It has a main fire system located in the storage room, which has one wired detector. In each room there is a wired smoke detector that is hooked up to this fire system. Each residence room also has an individual battery operated smoke detector. In the lobby there is one wired detector and one sounding alarm unit. There is also one detector in each of the two hallways and one sounding unit per hallway. Each hallway also contains one fire extinguisher

The Mary Wiehe contains six rooms that can hold two residents each making its capacity 12. It has a main fire alarm system located in the storage room, which has one wired smoke detector. In each room there is a wired detector that is hooked up to the main fire system. In the lobby there is two wired detectors and one sounding alarm unit. There is also one sounding unit in each of the two hallways. Each hallway also contains a fire extinguisher. In the laundry room there is one wired detector. In the two full bathrooms there is one wired detector each, along with one sounding unit. There is a half bath that has one wired detector and one sounding unit. There are two emergency lights per side of the building, one in the back hallway and one in the front near the lobby.
