You will march in line from the Burt Administration Building to the Mabee Sports Complex (HLGU's Walk of Honor) and to your seat. What to wear to your graduation (besides your cap and gown ©)

- Men—wear a long-sleeved dress shirt, tie, dark dress-slacks (no jeans), socks, & dress shoes.
- Women—wear a dress or skirt/top, dark dress pants (no jeans)/top, dress shoes (you will be walking from the Admin
 to the MSC...so you may want to wear comfortable dress shoes with a lower heel rather than a higher heel). It looks
 best if the dress or skirt does not hang below the hem of your gown.
- Stoles or medallions given to graduates to signify honors are worn over the gown.
- The cap is worn with the point in the center of the forehead and the mortarboard horizontal, not tilted to the back or the side.
- The tassel hangs on the right side until after degrees are granted and the Graduate's Pledge is recited. The class then switches the tassel to the left together.
- Men will remove the cap for prayer and put it back on after prayer. The cap is worn at all other times during the ceremony.
- Do not wear corsages, pins, jewelry, or anything else attached to your gown. Please do not decorate your mortarboard.
- Iron your cap and gown. (Or if you can't iron it, hang it on a hanger for several hours to allow some of the wrinkles to fall out.)

Cap and gowns will not be available until a few days before graduation. Once they are ready, an email will be sent to let you know. Cap and gowns are handled through the Campus Store located in the Foster Student Center.

Regular hours are M - F 10-Noon; 1-3 pm. Graduation day: 8 am – the procession starts.

<u>Undergraduate Honors</u>

Alpha Chi stoles will be awarded to qualified candidates during the graduation rehearsal. (Honors hoods will be awarded at a separate ceremony.)

Verbal recognition of honors will be given at commencement to honor graduates at the baccalaureate level. To receive honors, graduates must meet all three of the following requirements:

- Have earned a cumulative grade point average (CGPA) of 3.5 or above (includes hours completed at HLGU and transferred hours);
- Have completed all coursework or be within 3 hours of completion (including incomplete coursework); (If you
 need to take a course during the May term to fulfill your graduation requirements, you must be registered for
 those classes before graduation day.)
- Have completed at least half of the coursework toward the degree at HLGU to receive Latin honors. See HLGU's catalog, "Academic Honors Recognition" section in the current catalog (on page 45 of the 2023-24 printed catalog under www.hlg.edu) for additional information.
