Bachelor of Science in Nursing Admissions and Transfer Policies

Admission Requirements

Applicants to the Bachelor of Science in Nursing (BSN) program must meet the following requirement:

- 1. Possess an Associates of Science in Nursing (ASN) or Diploma in Nursing with at least a 2.5 GPA
- 2. Have an active, valid, unencumbered RN license

Your application will be reviewed by our admissions team who will evaluate your college transcripts, acceptance confirmed by email. Admission to the university does not guarantee acceptance into the BSN program.

After being admitted to the university, prospective BSN students will then apply to enter the BSN program. The BSN application will be reviewed by the Director of the School of Nursing, acceptance into the program confirmed in writing.

Transfer Policy

Students who are applying for the BSN degree programs can transfer in up to seventy (70) hours of junior/community college credit toward an RN to BSN degree. Transferred courses must meet the following criteria:

- Earn a grade of C or higher in all Science and Behavioral Science support courses.
- Earn a C- for remaining support course requirements.
- Earn a grade of B- or higher in all Nursing Core Requirements.

If you transferred into the ASN program from another school and certain credits were not transferred because they were not required, you can request the Registrar reassess your transcript to see if you are eligible to transfer additional courses.
