### University and Department Policies

A maximum of 64 hours may be transferred from a community college. The last 32 hours must be taken in residence at HLGU. The Teacher Education Program requires a grade of C or higher for all professional education and content area courses. Additionally, students must earn a grade of C or higher for the following Gen. Ed. courses: College Algebra, English Comp. I, English Comp. II, and Intro. to Speech. GPA Requirements:

 Students MAY NOT enroll for 300-level or 400-level courses until they have fulfilled all program admission requirements. (includes documented passage of MoGEA)  
 Students must have a MO Content Assessment score on file to graduate.

<sup>1</sup> Required of all incoming full-time freshmen and transfer students with less than 24 hours.  
<sup>2</sup> Requirement includes three areas: art, music, and theatre. For students seeking certification in art or music, the fine arts requirement is fulfilled by courses in their subject area certification requirements. ART 111, 112, 280, 340 will not satisfy the art requirement. THR 100, 103, 110 will satisfy the theatre requirements. Applied music will not satisfy the music requirement.  
<sup>3</sup> Students must take two of the following: HST 213, 223; PLS 113. Social Studies majors must take all three.  
<sup>4</sup> Must be biology or botany with lab. Students seeking certification in physical education must take BIO 105 (General Biology).  
<sup>5</sup> Must be a course chosen from one of the following course offering areas: chemistry, physics, or physical science.  
<sup>6</sup> Lab Requirement: One of the science classes must have an accompanying lab.  
<sup>7</sup> MTH 143 (College Algebra) or higher level, excluding MTH 163 (Structure of the Real Number System). A mathematics placement exam is required for all who do not have College Algebra credit.  
<sup>8</sup> Students may select from the following acceptable activity courses: one-hour courses at the PHE 100-level, any varsity or junior varsity sport, and PHE 219 (Lifeguarding). (REC courses do not fulfill this requirement).  
<sup>9</sup> Co-requisite with EDU 223  
<sup>10</sup> Co-requisite with EDU 203  
<sup>11</sup> Co-requisite with EED 383.  
<sup>12</sup> Co-requisite with SED 423
