

Post-Graduation Education and Employment

As part of the graduation process, graduating students are asked to provide the institution information about their current employment status and future educational plans. This information is gathered through an online survey, called the Graduating Student Survey. In an effort to inform graduating students about the survey and its URL location, the Student Records Office emails candidates a graduation checklist. The Graduating Student Survey is opened at least two weeks before the end of the semester. The checklist includes the survey URL and other important information.
