### Verification of 2019 Income Information for STUDENT TAX FILERS

**Instructions:** Complete this section if the student and spouse <u>filed or will file</u> a 2019 IRS income tax return(s). The best way to verify income is by using the IRS Data Retrieval Tool (IRS DRT) that is part of FAFSA on the Web at FAFSA.gov. In most cases, no further documentation is needed to verify 2019 income information that was transferred into the student's FAFSA using the IRS DRT if that information was not changed.
