HOW TO REPORT

You have several choices:

Report online by visiting HLGU's Title IX Website

Report to the Title IX Coordinator Jordahn Leonard

Report to any member of the Title IX Team

Provide as much or as little information as you want; visit in person, make a phone call, or email.

Although it is not required, you're encouraged to report to the police; HLGU will help you work with them.

Reporting to a member of the Title IX team will enable the college to take measures to stop the behavior, prevent it from occurring in the future, and provide support, resources, and protection.
