c. Fine Arts and Humanities

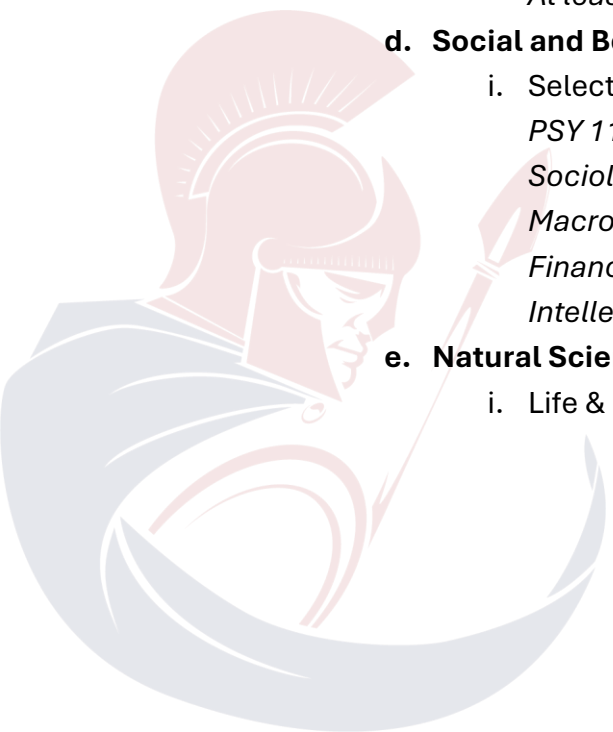
- i. Select three credit hours from LIT (3 credits)

PHL 213 Introduction to Philosophy, CMN 313 Christian Professional Ethics, PHL 253 Introduction to Logic, or any additional LIT course.
- iv. Select six credit hours from HST and/or PLS (6)
At least three hours must be in US history.

d. Social and Behavioral Sciences

- i. Select three credit hours from the requirements below (3 credits)
PSY 113 General Psychology or higher, SOC 113 Introduction to Sociology, SOC 123 Marriage & Family, ECO 213 Macroeconomics, ECO 223 Microeconomics, FIN 101 Personal Finance, CRJ 113 The US Criminal Justice System, or HON 301 Intellectual Development of the Western World.

e. Natural Sciences

- i. Life & Non-Life Science Courses (7 credits)





Students must take at least one course from each of two science areas: one in the life sciences (for example: biology, ecology) and one in non-life science (for example: chemistry, physics, earth science); at least one of these courses must be a lab course. Transfer students with six credit hours of science with no lab should contact the Chair of the Natural Science Department.

f. Mathematics

- i. Select appropriate mathematics course (3 credits)

For BS or BA programs, only MTH 127, MTH 131, 143, 153, or 185 will meet this requirement. Several mathematics-intensive majors require the completion of MTH 143 or higher to complete this requirement. MTH 127, and MTH 131 cannot be used as a prerequisite to any other mathematics course. Academic advisors will use the mathematics placement policy to ensure enrollment in the appropriate course. (See [Mathematics Placement Policy](#) in Academic Section.)

- i. HLT 183 Personal Health & Fitness (3 credits)

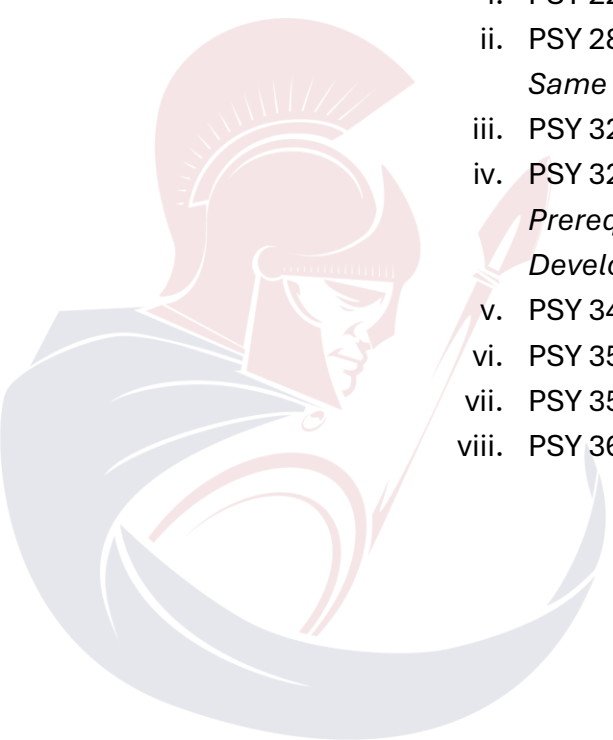
Two hours of physical education transfer credits will meet this requirement.
